





Tom Lehman Takes Colorado

Contrary to urban legend, nice guys don't always finish last. During his long career on the PGA Tour and his (thus far) short career on the Champions Tour, Tom Lehman has always been one of golf's good guys. He's one of the lunch bucket guys — he shows up, plays his heart out and is gracious in both defeat and victory.

designed course — that Lehman realized the win was well within his grasp.

The threesome had finished 72 holes of regulation golf at 281, 7-under-par. Frost had gotten there with a final-round 67. Couples was there after a final-round 69. Lehman, who had started the day one shot behind leader Jay Don Blake, fired 71 on Sunday.

The playoff got underway with Lehman hitting first and finding the fairway. Frost then hit his tee shot into a fairway bunker. Couples put his tee shot into a bush. And as Frost and Couples finished slashing their way up the final hole, Lehman, who found the putting surface with his second shot, lost count.

Lehman's resume includes a major championship, the 1996 (British) Open Championship, as well as four other victories during his PGA Tour career. Not bad for a guy who had very humble beginning as a club pro in Minnesota.

In addition to winning the (British) Open Championship in 1996, he also won a PGA Tour money title and was named PGA Tour Player of the Year that same year. He has played on three U.S. Ryder Cup teams, captained another and at one time he stood No. 1 in the world rankings.

And, much to his own surprise when it happened, he's now a major championship winner on the Champions Tour. Lehman won the 71st Senior PGA Championship, the oldest title in senior golf, when it was played this year at the Colorado Golf Club in Parker, and he did it by taking the first hole of a three-way playoff that included Fred Couples and David Frost.

It wasn't until the threesome finally got to the green on the first playoff hole — the par-4 18th of the Crenshaw-Coore

“That was just a bizarre playoff,” he said. “I’m not sure I’ve ever experienced anything like that. I turned to my caddie and asked, ‘How many shots have they taken?’”


The answer was easy. Way too many.

While Frost, who never saw the fairway all the way up the playoff hole, and Couples, who had to take an unplayable lie, each carded double-bogey, Lehman calmly — at least on the outside — two-putted for a winning par.

“I really didn’t do anything exceptional,” Lehman said just moments after lifting the Alfred S. Bourne Trophy, on which his name will now be engraved with former winners including Gene Sarazen, Sam Snead, Arnold Palmer, Jack Nicklaus, Lee Trevino and Hale Irwin.

“I just didn’t make any mistakes.”

According to Lehman, he had an advantage going into the playoff. Unlike





Frost and Couples who had finished their final rounds and had to wait to see if there would indeed be a playoff, Lehman signed his card and went right back to the tee, drawing the first spot in the batting order.

“I think I had an advantage right from the start,” he said. “The longer you have to wait, I think the tougher it gets to play in a playoff.”

After hitting just four times in sudden death, Lehman owned one of the biggest prizes in professional golf, perhaps making up for a couple that got away back in the days before he became a senior.

He was third at the 1993 Masters and second in a quest for a green jacket in 1994. And in four straight years (95-98), Lehman played in the final group on U.S. Open Sunday.

Those four years he finished third, second, third and fifth.

“I’ve had some near misses,” he said. “But I’ve had some of those misses on days when I played really well. But at the end of the day, I feel like I can hold my head up high, knowing that I competed well enough to win many times.”

This time around there was no near miss.

The win was the first on the Champions Tour for Lehman, who celebrated his 50th birthday a little more than a year before the tournament. He had partnered with Bernhard Langer, another good guy, to win the 2009 Liberty Mutual Legends of Golf, but on a sunny Sunday in Colorado he stood alone at the top at a major championship.

“To get back in the winner’s circle after being close a lot feels really good,” Lehman said. “I just kind of hung in there.”

It was another day in the life of one of the good guys.



In 2009, hockey All-Star Joe Sakic hung up his professional skates, enabling him to spend more quality time with his family and on the golf course. The popular Avalanche officially retired his legendary jersey, and in 2010 he was inducted into the Colorado Sports Hall of Fame. Despite all of the changes in his life, one thing remains constant: Sakic is unwavering in his passion to fight childhood hunger in Colorado. He and his wife, Debbie, have signed on again this year to partner with Food Bank of the Rockies (FBR).

This August will mark the 13th year of the **Joe Sakic Celebrity Golf Tournament** and the **Joe and Debbie Sakic Bringing Hope to the Table celebration**, two annual fundraising events that have become the financial backbone for FBR's children's programs.

More than 150,000 children in Colorado don't know where their next meal will come from. Hunger is often an invisible issue, especially for these children who don't have a voice. Thirteen years ago Joe and Debbie Sakic made the decision to become that voice, and they've made a world of difference for Colorado children ever since.

FBR has been fighting hunger and feeding hope through nearly 1,000 partner agencies for 32 years. Last year alone, more than 367,000 people were served. That number has risen nearly 18 percent in the past year. Over 42 percent of those served through FBR's partner agencies are children. While hunger at any age is debilitating, it is especially hard on children. Over the course of the partnership with the Sakics, FBR has been able to provide 13.3 million meals to Colorado children in need.

"During tough economic times, Deb and I are even more passionate about fighting childhood hunger," Sakic says. "No child should be hungry. They can't support themselves and it's important that we give back. Together we can provide hope and much needed nutrition to Colorado kids."

On Thursday, August 26, celebrities and sponsors will join Joe for the 13th annual Joe Sakic Celebrity Classic Golf Tournament, presented by RE/MAX International at the acclaimed Sanctuary

Golf Course. Dave and Gail Liniger, co-founders of RE/MAX International, created Sanctuary on a wildlife refuge in Colorado's Front Range for the exclusive use of selected charities and invited guests. *Golf Digest* and *Golfweek* rank Sanctuary among the top golf courses in the nation. More importantly, in Sanctuary's 13-year history, charity golf tournaments hosted there have raised millions of dollars for important causes.

Friday evening, August 27, the Sakics will host an elegant celebration of dining, entertainment and high-end auction items. The Joe and Debbie Sakic Bringing Hope to the Table Celebration, Presented by CoBank and RBC Wealth Management, will take place in Lone Tree at the Marriott South Park Meadows. Comedian Jake Johannsen will provide the entertainment. The event kicks off with a cocktail reception at 6:00 p.m., followed by dinner. Susie Wargin of 9NEWS and Marc Moser of the Altitude Radio Network will emcee the festivities.

In addition to RE/MAX, the 2010 Joe Sakic Celebrity Classic has many sponsors from Colorado's business community, including CoBank, RBC Wealth Management, UMB, FirstBank, Maverick Company, Panera Bread, St. Mary Land & Exploration, Starz Entertainment, Halliburton, EnCana Oil & Gas, TAG, Birchwood Resources, Colorado Avalanche, Colorado Casualty, Specialized Loan Services, Total Transportation, US Food Service and 104.3 The Fan.

Ryder Cup Matches



Can Team USA triumph in Europe to
retain the Cup so valiantly won at
Valhalla? All eyes are on Wales

Founded over 80 years ago on prestige, pride and golfing camaraderie rather than prize money, the Ryder Cup matches have grown and evolved.

The History

The initial informal matches were played in 1921 at Gleneagles, Scotland. The British trounced the Americans 9-3. In 1926, London's Wentworth hosted another unofficial match. Samuel Ryder, an ardent spectator at Wentworth and a wealthy English seed-packet magnate, was a late-in-life golfer who took up the game after his 50th birthday. Ryder's private pro was British star Abe Mitchell. Mitchell beat then reigning British Open champion, American Jim Barnes, 8 and 7 in the singles. He partnered with George Duncan in the foursomes to beat Walter Hagen and Barnes, 9 and 8. The U.S. team was overwhelmed again, this time 13 1/2 to 1 1/2.

At tea after the matches, Ryder met with British team members Duncan and Mitchell. Hagen and U.S. teammate Emmett French joined them. The idea of a trophy and matches came from the tea

foursomes matches the first two days, twelve singles matches on the third day for 28 total points.

Before Continental Europe players joined the competition, the team made up solely of players from Great Britain and Ireland won only three times from the Cup's inception. Since 1985, however, the Europeans have won eight of twelve Ryder Cup Matches.

The Course

The 38th Ryder Cup Matches will be played at Celtic Manor in Newport, Wales, from Oct. 1 to 3. This will be the first time in the history of the Cup that the matches will be played in Wales. The host venue is a stunning five-star resort with a course built especially for the Matches. It's nestled on 1,400 acres of breathtaking woodlands only two hours from London. Of course, Welsh golfers from Ian Woosnam to Brian Hugget have played significant roles in many of the past Matches, both as players and captains.

The Twenty Ten Course, which opened July 2007, is the first course to have been designed and built specifically for the Ryder

table. Ryder enthusiastically ordered a gold chalice with Mitchell's likeness on the top — the Ryder Cup. In Ryder's view the matches were not just about competition but also about building relationships.

According to his daughter, Joan, "When the Americans came over for a match he would give a 'small friendly lunch party' for both teams."

Play formats have changed several times over the years. The current format was inaugurated in 1979: four four-ball and four

Cup. The par 71, 7,493-yard layout offers optimum challenge to the world's best golfers in various match-play formats — a maximum of risk and reward opportunities. Long rough and greenside swales will be prevalent, and water hazards come into play on half the course. Nine new holes meander along the floor of the beautiful Usk Valley, complemented by nine remodeled holes that were part of the former Wentwood Hills Championship course. This course is also the first to consider the viewing needs of Ryder Cup fans. Great vantage points for the public were built into the overall design.

The Captains

U.S. Captain, California native son Corey Pavin, has the critical mission to retain the Cup at Celtic Manor. Winner of the 1995 U.S. Open at Shinnecock Hills, the 5'9" UCLA graduate has won around the world since turning pro in 1982. Known for years as "The Bulldog," Pavin's impressive achievements include 15 PGA victories, 12 international victories and participation in three Ryder Cup and two President's Cup matches. Having recently turned 50, Pavin is now playing on the 2010 Champions Tour as well as the PGA Tour. He wants to "to stay in touch with the guys [who will make up the team], playing as much as possible with them."

Pavin has an impressive 60-percent win record in the Ryder Cup, with eight U.S. points. In 2006, he was Tom Lehman's assistant captain at the K Club in Ireland.

"I remember being part of the last U.S. victory abroad at The Belfry in 1993," he says. "Victory is our goal for 2010, but we all need to have fun and enjoy the moment."

Captain Corey is doing his all to fulfill his mission. He has appointed four assistant captains: Tom Lehman, Davis Love III, Jeff Sluman and Paul Goydos. He wants experience, communication, strategy and team spirit to be enhanced to the maximum for Team USA. A fine new addition to the behind-the-scenes team is his wife, Lisa Pavin, who is helping to coordinate the administrative side of Team USA and its commitments. She has even created Ryder Cup cupcakes!

Scotland's Colin Montgomerie, who has long brought his A game to the Matches, will captain this year's European team. "Monty" played on eight Ryder Cup teams from 1991 to 2008. The 45-year-old, who will be the 22nd European and sixth Scottish captain, has been Europe's star and most forceful player with a 20-9-7 record in the Cup since his initial appearance.

Monty has never lost a singles match—an incredible Ryder Cup record. But this year is something different for him. "This is the proudest moment of my career," he says. "Playing in eight Ryder Cups and winning eight Harry Vardon trophies [has been incredible], but to be named The European Team Ryder Cup captain is something to cherish."

Monty has never served as assistant captain or captain, so he's now learning the tournament's behind the scenes demands, studying them with his well-known dedication. He will lead a very strong European side to Wales.

2010 Teams

Twelve men compete for each side. The selection process has been modified for 2010.

Team Europe: European members will be selected employing the team's traditional criteria; however, new in 2010, Montgomerie will choose the final three players.

Team USA: The United States points system remains the same as the 2008 criteria for choosing the top eight players. These will be selected on August 15. Pavin will then select an additional four players on Sept. 7 to complete the United States roster.

Team USA's defense of the Cup is not to be missed. Drama, excitement and great shot making will be present at the Ryder Cup Matches as always, and space for fans is still available. Captain Corey and Team USA want your support in their efforts to retain the cup abroad for the first time since 1993.





The Big Cat returns to Colorado—not in the ballpark but on the golf course

What do five-time All-Star Andres Galarraga, the Denver Chop House and Sanctuary Golf Course have to do with one another? They're all part of the **2010 Legends Golf Tournament**, which benefits critical programs for at-risk women and children in Colorado.

The tournament kicks off on Aug. 11 with a player's party at **Denver Chop House & Brewery**. The "Big Cat," a.k.a. former Colorado Rockies star Galarraga, will be on hand to talk, mingle and sign autographs. While Galarraga didn't finish his career with the Rockies, he was on the inaugural team when it became part of major league baseball in 1993, and he holds a slew of records from his years in Colorado. The team is so excited about Galarraga's return to the Centennial State that they'll honor him at Coors Field on Aug. 13. The party is sponsored by **CoBiz Insurance**.

That's just the start. Players will gather at 9:30 a.m. on Aug. 12 for the tournament, played at exclusive **Sanctuary Golf Course** in Sedalia, Colo. Galarraga will be on hand to meet, greet and autograph golf balls for every player, and he'll be teeing up in a foursome as well.

Sanctuary stands not just as a testament to superb golf course design, but also as a beacon for environmental stewardship and charitable giving. RE/MAX International co-founders Dave and Gail Liniger conceived of Sanctuary as an invitation-only golf course devoted exclusively to positive impact, both in terms of the ecosystem in which it sits and its larger community. Kids Who Play

Whether you start them on their own brand or the brand you like best, kids should use golf equipment made especially for young players

When a child says the magical words to his father or mother, *I'd like to play golf with you*, part of the excitement is a trip to the golf store. It's exciting for the parent because visiting the golf store is always fun. It's exciting for the child because, as we all remember, new sports equipment gets the heart beating a little faster.

Many companies that sell golf equipment for adults also offer excellent junior clubs and accessories. If you're loyal to a manufacturer, there's a good chance your son or daughter can have the same type of equipment.




Ping offers two sets of clubs for juniors, the Pal and the Moxie (\$225). The Pal is for ages 6-8, the Moxie is for ages 9-11. Clubs have lightweight graphite shafts and junior grips; Ping junior clubs have the same perimeter-weighted technology as Ping adult clubs.

The **Nike** Tiger Woods Black Junior Set is for 8- 11-year-olds; certain websites are offering the set for \$129, a saving of close to \$100. The nine-piece set includes a driver, hybrid, three irons, a sand wedge, plus EZ-Distance Gold balls.



The X Junior Set from **Callaway** (\$199) is for 5-8 year olds or players between 41 and 50 inches tall. The 320cc driver is almost as big as one of the adult 460cc drivers. The set also includes a stainless-steel fairway wood, a hybrid, a 9-iron and a sand wedge with "Mack Daddy" junior grooves. The Callaway set offers an XJ Odyssey 2-Ball Putter with the same 2-ball alignment as in the adult version. And because it's a junior set, it has a junior bag and because it's a junior bag, it provides a holder for an MP3 player. Cool.



TaylorMade makes several junior sets, including one for very young golfers age 4-6. Its Eight-Piece Junior Set (\$219) includes Burner clubs, a Burner Junior Carry Bag, plus a Burner hat and Burner towel.



Hippo Golf offers excellent value with its Hipfly Red Junior Set (\$99) for ages 6-8. The set includes a TiMattix oversize driver. The mallet-head putter has a polymer insert for excellent feel. The four-club set includes a stand bag.



TourEdge also provides excellent value with its Bazooka GeoMax junior sets starting at \$79. Buying a full set is not mandatory; TourEdge has individual irons starting at \$14.99.



CLUBS FOR GIRLS

Seeing as boys and girls are different, some companies offer clubs specifically for girls and these junior sets include a lot of pink.

The **Callaway X Junior Girls Six-Piece Set** is for 5-8 year olds and includes the prettiest golf bag made: it's festooned with pink, black and large flowers. For even more pink, the **Lynx 2008 Pink Junior Set** has a golf bag that's almost all pink and includes a driver, three irons and a putter.

SHOES & CLOTHING

Should you want your child to have the same brands of apparel and shoes that you wear, several companies have excellent junior options.

The **Adidas Golf K Gazelle Golf Shoe** comes in a variety of colors including pink. It has suede uppers that give the shoe a cool retro look. The shoe also has ample room toward the front for extra comfort. The Adidas Girl's White Based Sleeveless Top will help your future LPGA player feel trendy.

The **Nike Junior Boys TW 2010 Golf Shoe** also comes in a variety of colors and it features Nike's Power Platform Flex systems. The Nike Boys Sphere Dry Blocked Polo is made with Sphere Dry fabric to keep young male golfers looking and feeling cool.

FootJoy offers an extensive selection of shoes for juniors in sizes 1 to 6. The line features easy-care synthetic uppers and full cleats from Softspikes. The collection comes in numerous color combinations. FootJoy's MyJoy program offers customization and sizes start at size 7 for men and size 5 for women.

ACCESSORIES

Accessories are vital for juniors and there are plenty of extremely cool ones on the market. Fanciful head covers by **Winning Edge** come in various themes including a lion, panther, duck and Popeye.

Gadgetry is vital to children in the 8- 13-year range. A great first golf gadget would be a rangefinder, especially now that

prices are coming down on golf GPS systems. The **Golf Buddy Pro GPS** is around \$110 and includes numerous features with no monthly or annual fee.

Finally, what about golf balls? While not designed specifically for juniors, the Chromax Titanium ball from **Chromax Golf** is very popular with younger players. The ball has a metallic layer that reflects sunlight, which makes it extremely easy to see. It also comes in some bright colors and meets USGA specifications. With a relatively low 75 compression, the Chromax helps juniors with a little extra distance and is soft around the greens.

"The ball is a lot of fun for juniors because it looks cool," says Greg Jenkins with Chromax.

The Chromax Titanium retails for about \$3 to \$3.50 per ball. It's available in six-packs, a pack of three or individually.

CLUBFITTING

Serious golfers know that fitting is a vital part of ensuring that a set of golf clubs performs well. Fitting is particularly important for juniors. A junior who is eight years chronologically may well need golf clubs built for a 12-year-old. A 12-year-old might need a set build for a nine-year-old. The best way to find out for sure: take that always-exciting trip to the golf store where professional fitters can help.

Martin Laird is going home.

The former Colorado State University standout will be in the field when the 2010 (British) Open Championship starts July 15 at the historic Old Course at St. Andrews, the birthplace of golf as we know it today.

Laird qualified for a spot in the 2010 Open Championship by firing rounds of 69-63 in an international qualifier played in Texas to

grab one of the eight qualifying spots available to the field of 60 players.

"Maybe I need to take this mentality to tournaments," Laird said immediately after the qualifier. "Just let loose and fire at the flags."

It's a plan that worked before for the guy who was a two-time All-American during his college playing days at Fort Collins. Laird won the 2009 Justin Timberlake Shriners Hospitals for Children tournament in Las Vegas by putting together rounds of 63-67-67-68 — good enough to get him into a three-way playoff with Chad

Campbell and George McNeil, which he won in sudden-death.

That win was also one for the PGA Tour record books. Laird became just the third native Scot—he was born in Glasgow in 1982—to win on the PGA Tour, joining 1988 Masters champion Sandy Lyle and 1999 Open Championship winner Paul Lawrie.

Laird finished the 2009 season with more than \$1.35 million in winnings, a lot of money whether you're counting in American dollars or Scottish pounds.

While he donned the green-and-gold of CSU during his college days, Laird has never forgotten the land of his birth. There is a Scottish flag on his golf bag, his belt and on his specially made tees.

A good finish at St. Andrews could draw even more attention for Laird from European Ryder Cup captain Colin Montgomerie, also a Scot, when it comes time for Monty to make his captain's picks for the team that will compete against the Americans at the 2010 matches to be played later this year at Celtic Manor Resort in Newport, South Wales.

As of May Laird, who now calls Scottsdale, Ariz., home, had played in 14 Tour events and made the cut nine times. His best finish came at the season-opening SBS Championship in Hawaii, and he added another top-10 finish when he tied for 10th at the Crowne Plaza Invitational at Colonial. He has earned more than \$607,000 so far in 2010 and stands 76th on the PGA Tour

money-winning list going into The Memorial Tournament.

Unlike a lot of Americans who will making the trip "across the pond" for the 139th playing of the world's oldest professional golf tournament, Laird won't have to struggle with finding things like hotel rooms, seats in restaurants or a rental car. He'll be staying at home. Really at home.

"My parents live about 15 miles from St. Andrews," says Laird, who played the Old Course as a youngster. "And that's the place I always wanted to play. Playing there in the Open Championship is the culmination of a dream."

From Commerce City to Cañon City there are golf
course communities with much to offer





This month we take you along the Front Range, from just north of Denver through Colorado Springs and on into Cañon City. There are currently 517 golf course homes available in this area through resale, with prices ranging from \$135,000 to just under \$5 million. Of these, 97 are priced over the \$1 million mark.

In the past 20 years or so there has been a trend in golf course development. Approximately 95 percent of all new courses are designed from the start as part of a golfing community, meaning that courses are being built with homes designed into the layout of the course. Naturally, the recently built courses also feature newer resale homes as well as brand new homes from builders. It could be estimated that nearly half of all the homes for sale lining today's golf courses are brand new.

Located in the northern suburbs of Denver in Commerce City, a city undergoing a major facelift, is **Buffalo Run Golf Course**. Buffalo Run is a par-72 layout designed by Keith Foster as a British links-style public course. The five sets of tees accommodate all levels of play. The course, which measures 7,411 yards from the tips and 5,277 yards from the forward tees, has garnered local and national recognition, including being named four straight years among the *Golf Digest* Places to Play. Locals agree.

The popular course has also been the host site for several prestigious tournaments, including the Denver Open, U.S. Open Qualifiers and CGA/CWGA State Championships. With its



proximity to downtown Denver, Denver International Airport and other major employment centers, as well as easy access to I-70, I-76, highways 2 and 85 and the E-470 beltway, this area offers a convenient commute to almost anywhere in the northern metro area. Commerce City is also adjacent to one of the nation's largest urban space reserves, the 10,000-acre Rocky Mountain Arsenal National Wildlife Refuge.

Buffalo Run Golf Course, host of the 2006 Parade of Homes, offers some of the most affordable golf course residences in the state. Resale home prices start in the mid \$100s and climb up to the mid \$700s. Gated patio-home communities start in the mid \$200s. One example is The Fairways at Buffalo Run, which offers a turnkey lifestyle.

Halfway between Larkspur and Castle Rock on I-25 sits **The Golf Club at Bear Dance**. Designed and built by PGA Members Corey Aurand, Stuart Bruening, Dennis Hogan and Brian





Whitcomb, and home to the Colorado Section of the PGA of America, Bear Dance provides a true Colorado golf experience, as well as a place where archives and keepsakes of the Colorado PGA will be preserved.

Consistently rated as Colorado's best and most challenging public golf course, Bear Dance offers generous tree-lined fairways framed by flashing white-sand bunkers, striking water features and intricate greens. With no contiguous fairways on the par 72, 7726-yard layout, you'll enjoy a very private and serene round of golf. Elevation varies 600 feet throughout the course, which has ample pot bunkers, mounds and water hazards to test your accuracy. There are also two par-4s that measure 502 yards. The short downhill par-4, 315-yard No. 6 features a minefield of pot bunkers; you can't miss one in particular, the vision of a bear paw sculpted in sand.

Taylor Mountain Ranch at Bear Dance is offering only 47 home sites. The community is keeping the area as natural as possible, and homes and home sites are currently available from \$400,000 to over \$8 million.

Antler Creek Golf Course is an 18-hole public course designed by Rick Phelps that opened for play in 2004. The course measures over 8,100 yards from the tips, making it Colorado's longest golf

course. It features three lakes and 73 bunkers and its wide fairways wind through the Woodman Hills and Meridian Ranch communities just to the northeast of Colorado Springs.

With six sets of tees, Antler Creek provides both challenge and joy for all levels of golfer. The player-friendly design incorporates the natural Colorado terrain and native grasses to create a "prairie dunes" style course unique to the Pikes Peak region. For avid golfers who want to live in a golf course community but don't want to spend a fortune for their home, Antler Creek may be the answer.

Prices in the Woodman Hills and Meridian Ranch areas start in the mid \$100s and climb into the \$500,000 range. Woodman Hills is the largest development in the Colorado Springs area with many lots 1/2 acre and one acre in size. What better way to enjoy all that the city has to offer than by owning a home on one of the newest courses in the area?

About 45 minutes southwest of Colorado Springs sits the welcoming town of Cañon City and one of Colorado's newest golf communities. **Four Mile Ranch Golf Club** opened in 2008 with another great Jim Engh-designed course that plays to 7,053 yards. Four Mile Ranch is the result of Ross Jeffery's vision to design and build a master-planned community that would appeal to a multi-generational population and varied lifestyles.

Cañon City's climate is among the best in the state — approximately 325 days of sunshine annually allowing for year round golf. Spectacular views of the Wet Mountains and the Sangre de Cristo Range surround the community. A full 46 percent of the Four Mile Ranch acreage is dedicated to open and recreational space while just 10.8 percent of the community will have commercial development. Current plans are for 2,505 new residences consisting of single-family homes, cluster homes, townhomes and apartment homes. Home sites on or near the golf course will initially be priced from \$50,000 to \$250,000.







Bright flowers are popping up everywhere, and not just alongside manicured lawns or in meticulous flowerpots—flower designs are blooming in many jewelry lines. Rings with diamond flowers in the center, necklaces with flower pendants and bracelets with interlocking flowers are perfect for summer. Better yet, they give you a bloom that will never wilt and, when worn, will always serve as a dazzling day-brightener.

The Enchanted Pink Lotus ring by **DeBeers**, \$3,200, has pink and white diamonds set in rose and white gold. The Lotus Flower shares its universal symbolism of purity, beauty and eternity with the diamond, and according to DeBeers, the elusive Pink Lotus blossom is known as the supreme lotus—reserved for only the most special person and occasion. A coordinating Pink Lotus pendant, \$3,200, and bracelet, \$1,500, are available. Wildflower pave stud earrings are available, \$500, as are a variety of other Wildflower designs.

Designer **Paul Morelli**, who works exclusively with yellow gold and platinum, has a Flower Power collection featuring pieces made in yellow gold with diamonds, with the end result being bright, cheery daisy pieces full of sparkle. Pave diamonds are inlaid in the gold for a dazzling, upscale look to a retro-shaped flower. The Flower Power necklace features bumblebee clasp accents, and coordinating bumblebee earrings are available.

Giovanni Designs International, known for its collection of 18-karat-gold glazed flower jewelry, has a new line called the Birth Flower Collection. Like birthstones, there is a flower for each month of the year. July is water lily, August is poppy and September is morning glory, for instance. Each flower also has a special meaning. Water lily, for example, represents “undying love” while carnation means “sweet and lovely/pure love.” The large gold flowers in this collection are made with a glazing process that creates a high luster. They can be worn as a pendant or as a brooch, and matching earrings also are available.

Tiffany & Co. has a new collection called Tiffany Garden. The graceful, feminine line is based on diamond floral brooches created by legendary designer Paulding Farnham (1859-1927). Trained in botanic illustration, Farnham was chief designer of Tiffany’s exhibits that won gold medals at the great World Expositions in the late 19th and early 20th centuries. Today, the collection’s petite flower pendants include citrine and diamonds in 18-karat yellow gold, lavender amethyst and diamonds in 18-karat rose gold and peridot and diamonds in 18-karat yellow gold. The collection also includes coordinating earrings and rings.

Chanel, the legendary Paris-based fashion house known for chic women’s dresses and tailored suits, also has an equally chic jewelry line. The Camellia flower was often featured in the late Coco Chanel’s designs, and today the Camellia is still prominently featured in current Chanel collections. The Chanel metal and glass pearl ring is a gold-tone Camellia flower with pearls and the signature interlocking Cs logo. There also is a long necklace with hand-enameled metal flowers and glass pearls, and a set of five

interlocking rings decorated with hand-enameled metal flowers. The spring/summer 2010 Chanel jewelry collection includes a clear resin bracelet with inlaid one-of-a-kind, handmade silk tulle flowers, in red, white and blue.

Inviting Vail Golf Club

Gorgeous mountain course is walkable, affordable, enjoyable –
and completely open to the public



Perfectly situated against a majestic mountain backdrop along Interstate 70, Vail Golf Club's wide, inviting fairways always manage to catch the eye of travelers during golf season. Many remember that the course hosted Gerald Ford's annual pro-am tournament for years, attracting celebrities from Clint Eastwood to Johnny Bench. The biggest misconception about the club? It's not a club.

"We've contemplated changing the name," says Director of Golf Alice Plain. "We look like we're an upscale course and we treat people like they're in a private club. But we're a very public golf course anyone can access."


In fact, the course is managed by the Vail Recreation District and becomes an official Nordic ski center during the winter. When the snow melts, golfers are treated to club conditions at recreation-center prices, and Plain says people are often surprised at just how affordable play here is.

The 7,024-yard design plays 18 holes naturally and intuitively through the White River Forest at 8,200 feet. Touchable mountains are easily visible and shots often incorporate Gore Creek, along with the occasional beaver pond. Hole 14 is an entertaining Par 3 with an elevated tee that plays across the creek.

"The layout includes holes that are parallel to each other," notes Plain. "It's playable and you can score well. As straight as the fairways look, once you reach the green it's a fun challenge, and you can't beat the mountain views. The turn at Hole 7 looks directly into the Gore Mountain Range."

Management is even willing to forego some cart revenue to promote golfers walking the course. The Recreation District encourages health and wellness, so it's only fitting that Vail Golf Club is, according to Plain, "the most walkable course in Eagle County."

What do players say about their experience? "Golfers comment on the great condition of the course and its beauty," Plain continues. "In summer it's spectacular and in fall the leaves change and the hillside is a golden color. If you're not playing very well, you can always look

at the view on every single hole." There's a full-service restaurant onsite, and a practice area is set up so that golfers hit straight at the mountain vista. It's a view Plain calls "one of the prettiest I've ever seen on a range."

Plain and VGC's head golf professional, Jeanne Sutherland, make up a female management team, something not often found in the industry. "The combination is quite rare as far as PGA members go," says Plain. "We were one of 24 in the country and the only one in the state of Colorado as of last year. We've focused a lot on women's programs and do a weekly ladies-only clinic women love. Jeanne has worked hard to bring the gals out here to play and it's made a difference."

The story of how Vail's first golf course began is legend in the Valley and full of small-town charm. According to Michael Ortiz, executive director of Vail Recreation District, Ben Krueger came through town in 1967 on his way to Aspen. "He was skiing here and heard we were looking to build a golf course, stuck his head in the office and says, 'Hey, I'm here.' Later, they call his name on the loudspeaker to come to the office, interview him and give him the job."

At the time, Vail Village was expanding and construction crews were the norm. "There's a photo of a crane doing work on I-70 in the background," Ortiz continues, "and Ben's rerouting the river to build his golf course. If you did that now you'd end up in jail. He was superintendent for a long, long time—in 42 years, we've had only four. He still plays golf about every morning, the first to go out. He keeps a watchful eye on the course and helps us keep it nice. He has a lot of passion for golf."

Krueger says the front nine was nearly completed when he was hired, and he created the back nine. With a University of Massachusetts education and experience in Denver at Cherry Hills and Los Verdes clubs, he was initially hired as Vail's manager of golf, tennis and fishing, and helped with snowmaking as well.

As for the river rerouting, "There were no barriers," he says matter-of-factly. "We were trying to build a golf course and keep high waters off. We designed it to be a tourist course to let them have fun. We built the whole back nine for \$150,000. I'm proud that in all the years since we built it hardly anything has changed. I don't get in their way, but I can't get it out of my mind—I love the course."

Andy Williams: Ageless Entertainment

Everyone has heard his melodic rendition of the haunting ballad, *Moon River*, but fewer know the role he has played in the world of golf—or how he ended up with a theater in Branson, Mo.


For 83-year-old legendary entertainer Andy Williams, age is only a number. Why? Because this award-winning recording artist is busier than ever performing at his own theater located in the once small Ozark town of Branson, Mo. What began as a visit to his friend Ray Stevens grew into something else altogether: the idea of opening his own venue.

Acquiescing to family, the surroundings and his love for performing, it wasn't long before Williams was calling Branson home and his new venue was a reality. The theater took its name from Williams' signature song, *Moon River*, made famous in the movie *Breakfast at Tiffany's*. Designed and constructed to reflect the surrounding Ozark Mountains landscape, Moon River Theatre opened in 1992 and almost immediately made headlines. It was the first theater to be featured in *Architectural Digest*, the first Branson theater opened by a non-country entertainer and it won the 1992 Conservation Award from the State of Missouri.

Today, Williams divides his time between homes at the Pointe Royal Country Club in Branson and La Quinta Country Club in La Quinta, Calif., homes he share with Debbie, his wife of 19 years, and their three dogs, Sophie, Henry and Abby. If there's one thing he likes to discuss, it's golf, a favorite hobby that he took up relatively late in life.

"I didn't start playing golf until about 1960," Williams says. "I was working at the Copacabana and Joey Bishop was my opening act. He asked me if I would come across to New Jersey to a country club that he belonged to and sing a couple of songs at an event they were having, I said sure. So I did and they gave me a set of clubs and said I could play there whenever I wanted, but I didn't play golf."

Into the closet went the clubs, even though Williams' three brothers played often. It wasn't until several years later when Williams was well established as a performer and had moved to California that he thought again of those clubs.

"After I moved to California I decided I would take up [golf] and joined the Bel-Air Country Club."

A past and current haven for celebrities, The Club, as it's commonly called, serves as a social location for many notable figures.

As Williams' game improved so did his love for charity golf tournaments. "I played in the Bob Hope, Bing Crosby and the Frank Sinatra for a long time," recalls the singer. "Golfing with Bob Hope was like playing in a tournament. There was always a crowd around and he played to the crowd. Being in Bob's foursome was a treat."

Williams also has fond memories of Dinah Shore. "If I were to be stuck on a deserted island with anyone, I couldn't think of a better person to be stuck with than Dinah Shore. She was not only intelligent, but she was also funny and enthusiastic about everything — and she was a good cook. I loved her. She was [also] perhaps the most important influence in women's golf."

Few of today's generation know how instrumental Williams was on the PGA tour with his own namesake tournament, the Andy Williams San Diego Open. This

successful event was held from 1968 to 1988 when Williams finally walked away, three years after Shearson-Lehman stepped in as the new presenting sponsor and started telling him how to run it.

"I hated the guy and didn't want to work with him, so I walked away," Williams says. The tournament is still played but is now known as the Farmers Insurance Open.

Currently a 25 handicap, Williams's was once as low as an 11. He considers himself a self-taught golfer though admits to a little help along the way. "I don't like the driving range," he says. "I work on my golf game while playing."

Williams is proud to say he's had three holes-in-one, two of them at La Quinta Country Club. Also members of The Hideaway in La Quinta, Williams says that he and Debbie, an accomplished golfer as well, spend more time on the golf course when they're in the desert.

"When I'm in Branson I'm working," notes Williams. Still, he's a member at Branson Creek Golf Club in Hollister, Mo. The couple also owns lots at Redlands Mesa in Grand Junction, Colo.

When asked how the game has enhanced his life, Williams replies with a chuckle, "It's given me a lot of joy and a lot of pain. It's a great game and I love to play as much as I can."

After a few seconds of silence the entertainer adds, "I like the camaraderie, having a foursome that is fun to play with and enjoying a beer afterward."

On and off the course, it seems that life for the legendary performer is good.

Celebrity golf tournament and silent auctions keep programs afloat for kids in the Roaring Fork Valley

Hear about Aspen Junior Golf Foundation and it's natural to think that the organization sponsors programs and camps entirely for youngsters whose families can easily afford the associated costs. But since its creation in 1989, the nonprofit has served children and teenagers in the entire Roaring Fork Valley — and that incorporates a wide range of tax brackets.

“We want to help kids that don't have the same opportunities other kids have,” says executive director Alden Richards. “We must rely on donations to enable our programs to continue.”

The mission of Aspen Junior Golf is not only to teach golf fundamentals and etiquette, but also to provide sportsmanship and character-building experiences to last a lifetime.

The annual Aspen Junior Golf Fundraiser features a celebrity golf tournament and related events for all ages July 11-12. The event begins on Sunday with a free baseball clinic hosted by the Major League Baseball Players Alumni Association, plus free hotdogs and soft drinks at the Iselin Baseball Field in Aspen — last year at least 100 kids participated. That night a pairings party at Hotel Jerome brings together amateur golfers and professional players, plus well-known sports personalities to mingle and bid on live and silent auction items.

“Last year the sports celebrities were there telling stories related to their youth on stage and a couple of the junior golfers came up, too,” says Richards.

Monday is all about golf, with the 18-hole celebrity-am tournament hosted by Aspen Golf Club. An awards get-together directly follows the friendly competition.

PGA player Chris DiMarco, a longtime supporter of the event, is expected once again to be on hand for all the activities. Richards says the Aspen foundation backs DiMarco's efforts to send children and teenagers to attend R.O.C.K. (Reaching Out to Cancer Kids) Camp in Florida. For this year's fundraiser, Aspen Junior Golf is also teaming up with Fullness of Life Foundation, focused on providing education and awareness about treatment options for cancer. Richards believes it's important for nonprofits to work together to raise funds, especially with current economic conditions.

“It's still tough to fundraise, and there are no guarantees that our programs will keep going,” he says. “Every year is a challenge, especially since 9/11. We're on a thread.”

Richards says his goal is to ensure that no programs are cut, and with the help of funds raised last year, some have even been enhanced. “We've added a new teaching area at the junior golfers' clubhouse with front and rear cameras, and a junior lounge area where kids can watch TV and just hang out. We've added Jim McLean, the No. 1 golf-school instructor in the country, with an elite camp that brings kids in. We've added staff and want to take Aspen Junior Golf to another level in Western Colorado, and continue to be considered the top junior program to send kids to.”

Among the organization's longtime supporters, notes Richards, are the R.H. Crossland Foundation, specifically Rusty and Ann Crossland, as well as Aspen Ski Company and Aspen Parks and Recreation. It's a community effort.

meaningful recreational, cultural and competitive experiences for individuals faced with cognitive or physical challenges. To put it another way, it's about creating life-changing adventures, and what better place to do that than in a town where adventure is around every corner — Aspen, Colo.?

The best news of all is that you can be part of it simply by playing golf and having a great time.

In addition to the gala and golf that are always part of this great event, there's an added special component this year. While the tournament and parties provide unforgettable moments in the lives of those who participate — to say nothing of a lot of fun — what's most important is that every person who joins in for the gala dinner and tournament is


